






AYHL ALL-STARS

- Netminder Ryan Murphy hails from Nazareth, PA and is in his 4th season with the Colonials.












COACH BRUCE SHATEL WINS #500


NJC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACHIEVES MILESTONE WITH DELBARTON




COMMUNITY SERVICE SPOTLIGHT




WINTER FUN @ PRUDENTIAL CENTER

COACH'S CORNER

EVERYTHING COUNTS, BUT NOTHING MATTERS (EXCEPT FOR COMPETE-LEARN-HONOR)

As a tennis coach, I often change up scoring rules, in and out boundaries, how many serves or returns are allowed, who plays with whom in doubles, etc., to create appropriate pressure and challenge during our pre-interscholastic competition. Invariably, in reaction to the strange changes someone will ask, "Do these results count?" And invariably, I respond that, yes, everything counts!

And the difficult corollary for many to understand is that, although every competition counts in your ranking, none of the winning and losing is what ultimately matters. Yes, if you win more than everyone else, you'll be #1, so these results clearly do matter in the short run.

But what matters in the long arc of your life as a player and a person is that you competed with 100% effort and with no excuses, you were an open, curious, and humble learner, and by how you acted, you brought credit to yourself, team, opponents, and the game. And the wins and losses happened and you learned from them, but without obsessing about them.

TRUTH BENDING

My saying "nothing matters" is both poetic license and coach license to bend the truth a little to get our students to step back and question the wisdom of placing winning on the highest pedestal.

Of course, whether we win or lose matters. As a competitor, you have to want to win—wanting to win is fine, and healthy. And winning is usually more enjoyable than losing, sure. But if you have to win to be ok with yourself and satisfied with your ongoing evolution as a player and a person, if winning matters that much for your life happiness and self-esteem, then we have a problem. You are going to be miserable much of the time, not just when you lose (which most of us do a good percentage of the time) but miserable even if you win but not in as dominating a way as you imagined you should (all of us pros and coaches have seen that dynamic at work, too!).

So the mindset I want is the somewhat contradictory "Everything counts, but nothing matters (except for Compete-Learn-Honor)." It helps them appreciate, over time (this insight doesn't come instantly), that they need to give their all in everything they do, but whether they won or lost doesn't really matter, what other people think about their performance doesn't really matter. It might matter in that quick moment, sure—we're all human, after all. But we can teach our players to not give that one fleeting moment of outcome so much weight.

What matters and will last far beyond brief moments is this: Were your players honorable, did they give the best they had without making excuses, did they keep learning from it all, and did they enjoy the ride, most of the time? Over the course of a few months (a season, a few tournaments), if you can help them answer "yes" to those questions, then I can guarantee they will improve and put themselves in position to win more often, and they probably also will have more fun, than if winning was the most important thing to them.

LESSONS IN LEADERSHIP

"Being a leader doesn't mean you have to win. It means playing with total commitment and focus, total energy, total smartness, total communication with your teammates, total positivity, totally loving the challenge of trying to solve the puzzles and problems of the game, without your ego or your fears getting in the way. All of that. That is giving it your all. Anything less is not giving it your all.

You give it your all like that, then it doesn't matter if you win or lose. You have shown yourself to be winners, and leaders, regardless of the outcome. That's the freedom that giving your all gives you. Give it your all with no excuses. If the other team wins, fine. They were better than you that day. Learn from it and move on. No excuses. Just learn.


The satisfaction you will have forever is not about the wins and losses—you'll forget about most of those pretty quickly—but about how fully you gave yourself to trying to compete at your very best, and feeling joy in that opportunity and challenge, win or lose."

So, teach this contradictory Zen of sports competition: "Everything counts, but nothing matters (except Compete-Learn-Honor)." They'll probably play better and have more fun as a result.




MARCELLO DeANGELIS YOUTH TIER 1 15 PURE 2010 AAA


